

Fourth Grade Supply List

Pencils – regular or mechanical (replenish often)

Blue or black pens (January). No gel pens, regular Bics are perfect!

3 red pens

1 yellow highlighter

1 pink pearl eraser

1 black sharpie, fine point

1 package wide-ruled loose leaf notebook paper

1 ream white printer/copy paper

5 marble composition notebooks, any design or color

3 sturdy folders with pockets, preferable the plastic kind (no prongs)

Scissors

2 boxes of 24 crayons, no markers

1 box of colored pencils (your choice of number of pencils)

2 glue sticks

1 bottle of white school glue

\$4 for a school issued planner

\$3 for a ruler and protractor. I will buy these over the summer so all the students will have the same type of tools. Any extra money will be returned.

2 boxes of tissue

Last names A-L: 2 rolls of paper towels

Last names M-Z: 1 container Clorox or Lysol wipes
